## Community Action Award Winners 2010



Over 60 voluntary organisations originally entered the Community Action Awards Competition 2010. Having entered a well worded application form (well done Martin) we were short listed down to the final 18, grouped into 6 categories. I was then asked to do a 30 minute presentation to a panel of judges on our work here on the Island. Then on June 24th we were invited to attend the awards ceremony being held at the Riverside Centre. To my utter amazement we won the "local communities" category with a prize of £250. Then as a category winner we went through to the overall final with the other 5 category winners. My heart was pounding as they announced the runners up, and then the words that I didn't think I would hear, "the overall winners with a prize of £1500 are the Street Pastors". There were cheers for us from all the people in the hall. So many people afterwards were approaching me, Sue and Sally to congratulate us, thank us for the work that we do, and say what deserved winners we were. It was a very exciting, humbling evening and credit must go to everyone in the Street Pastor scheme who works so hard. My sincere thanks goes out to you all.

### 16 New Volunteers Commissioned at Newport Minster

Approximately 300 people attended our latest commissioning service held on May 28th. Once again we were honoured to have Roger Reid from The Ascension Trust lead the service with Arch Deacon Caroline Baston. Words of endorsement were given by High Sheriff Peter Kingston and Councillor Barry Abraham. Straight after the service four teams of Pastors hit the streets of Newport. The response from the public was amazing. Many people had heard about us from our work in Ryde, and many people had no idea who we were, but all were really pleased of our presence.

### 22 Street Pastors Graduated

The evening also allowed us to honour and celebrate all the hard work and dedication of the first wave of Street Pastors who have made such a difference to the Streets of Ryde over the past year. Each one was awarded a certificate signed by the CEO of Ascension Trust Rev Les Isaac.

We now have 38 Street Pastors from 20 different churches, which means we can have a team in Ryde and Newport every Friday night until 3am.
